## 1. About Habitat for Humanity Nepal

Habitat for Humanity Nepal is an international non-governmental organization that is driven by the vision that everyone deserves a decent place to live. Our partnership with communities, governments, private sector including entrepreneurs and financial institutions, youth networks, and academia, allows us to serve low-income families by improving habitability, tenure security, access to basic services and affordability of housing solutions. Our integrated programming serves to benefit 2.7 million people over the next three years, through direct and incremental construction, affordable housing finance, affordable construction technologies and services, and evidence-based policy advocacy for housing adequacy as a fundamental right. Responding to the root causes of inequity in the housing ecosystem, Habitat Nepal leads with a systems-strengthening approach, facilitating development of inclusive housing markets, removing key policy barriers and empowering communities through people-centered approaches, for a stronger and more equitable housing ecosystem.

## 2. Background

Habitat for Humanity Nepal is seeking a qualified consultant (firm or individual) to conduct a baseline survey for the Systemic Action for Equity and Resilience (SAFER Nepal) project. The survey will establish baseline values for the project's outcome and impact indicators, providing a foundation for measuring changes resulting from project activities over the three-year implementation period.

## Project Information

Project Title	Systemic Action for Equity and Resilience - Nepal (SAFER Nepal)
Project Summary	Climate change and recurring disasters pose high risks to the communities in Nepal, particularly women, Dalits, and Persons with Disabilities, who are disproportionately affected due to systemic marginalization, unsafe living conditions, and limited participation in decision-making processes. Despite strong national frameworks on disaster risk reduction and climate resilience, gaps remain in inclusive implementation at the local level, highlighting the need to enhance capacity of local governments and vulnerable communities. In response, Habitat Nepal has partnered with NEEDS Nepal in Kanchanpur and CIC Nepal in Dhanusha to implement the SAFER project with the aim to strengthen gender-inclusive disaster risk reduction and climate-resilient measures.
Project Impact	Strengthen gender inclusive disaster risk reduction and climate resilient measures in Dhanusha and Kanchanpur districts by enhancing local governance capacity, empowering vulnerable groups particularly women, Dalits and persons with disabilities in two districts and advocating for gender just and inclusive policies at local level.

Project Outcomes	Outcome 1: Inclusive disaster risk reduction and climate resilience capacity, practices and policies are institutionalized into long-term local government planning and budgeting in Kanchanpur and Dhanusha districts. Outcome 2: Community groups, including youth and marginalized groups, are empowered and actively lead inclusive DRR and climate resilience actions, resulting in improved local preparedness and response capacity. Outcome 3: Government institutions at all levels coordinate and implement inclusive, GEDSI focused, DRR and climate resilience policies effectively, resulting in more equitable and efficient disaster risk reduction for vulnerable populations.

### 3. Objective

The objective of TOR is to conduct a survey to assess the baseline value of outcome and impact indicators. These values will be used to measure project achievements through measuring changes in the indicators' values by conducting endline survey with designated comparison groups.

The specific objectives are:

- To establish the baseline value of Project outcomes indicators as per the logical framework and MEAL plan that will be used as a basis to monitor and evaluate the progress and achievement of the project interventions through endline surveys.
- Assess the Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP) related to Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Climate Resilience Governance, and Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI) practices in the project palikas and districts, as well as at the federal, provincial, and local levels through a review of relevant policies and plans.
- Prepare and finalize the baseline report of the project

#### 4. Scope of Work

The Scope of the survey contains the following key components but not limited to:

##### **Baseline Assessment and Analysis**

- Develop and implement comprehensive research design, including survey tools development, determination of sample size, data collection, and analysis to establish baseline values for MEAL indicators.
- Assess Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP) related to Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR), Climate Resilience Governance, and Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI).
- Review and analyze relevant DRR, climate resilience, and GEDSI policies and plans at the federal, provincial, and local levels.
- Establish baseline values for agreed outcome and impact indicators.

##### **Data Collection and Stakeholder Engagement**

- Apply standard methodologies to ensure participation of women, Dalits, and Persons with Disabilities and other target groups of the project
- Conduct household surveys using a statistically appropriate minimum sample size.
- Consult with key stakeholders, including local governments, community representatives, and project partners

##### **Reporting and Validation**

- Analyze collected data, document findings and share it with Habitat Nepal
- Prepare and finalize a comprehensive baseline report addressing the feedback to inform project implementation, monitoring, and evaluation.

#### 5. Methodology

Based on the objectives and scope of work, the consultant (individual or firm) should propose an appropriate survey methodology, research design framework, and sample size to generate comprehensive baseline values for the project's outcome and impact indicators among its beneficiaries.

**Total Beneficiaries:** 14,750 (3,950 direct & 10,800 indirect beneficiaries' households). Out of them 26% families with disabled members. Out of the total direct beneficiaries, 26% families with disabled members.

**Working Municipalities:** Bedkot Municipality (two wards), Shuklaphata Municipality (two wards) and Bheemdatt Municipality (one ward) of Kanchapur district and Chhireshwarnath Municipality (two wards) of Dhanusha District.

**Total Household in working Municipalities:** Total 66,009 (Bedkot Municipality: 12,595, Bhimdatta Municipality: 27,570, Shuklaphata Municipality: 15,111 and Chhereshwarnath Municipality: 10,733)

**Samples size:** Sample size to be determined using a 5 % margin of error and 95 % confidence level from total beneficiaries' households (i.e. 14,750).

## 8. Qualifications, Skills, and Experience

Habitat Nepal is looking for a consultant/firm having the following qualifications:

**Technical Expertise:** The consultant/firm should have a minimum of five years of demonstrated experience in monitoring and evaluation, climate change, disaster risk reduction (DRR), and GEDSI. They should have proven expertise in conducting both quantitative and qualitative studies, with a strong track record in analyzing and reporting outcomes and impacts on poor, Dalit, marginalized communities, women, and Persons with Disabilities.

**Survey and Evaluation Experience:** Proven competency in designing and implementing baseline and endline studies, including data analysis and reporting on outcomes and impacts of similar projects related to Climate Change, DRR, and GEDSI.

**Knowledge of Local Context:** Strong knowledge of the subject matter, local community dynamics, and governance structures in Nepal.

**Data Integration and Analysis:** Strong skills in systematic collection, integration, and analysis of qualitative and quantitative data.

**Research Tools and Methods:** Experience in developing and using research tools, including literature reviews, household surveys, focus group discussions, and key informant interviews with diverse respondent groups (e.g., women, person with disability, community members, government, and non-government stakeholders).

**Ethics and Methodology:** Proven experience in applying ethical standards in data collection, processing, and analysis.

**Technical Proficiency:** High proficiency in Microsoft Word and Excel; practical experience with information management and analysis software such as Kobo, ODK, SPSS, or equivalent.

**Team Coordination:** Ability to work and coordinate effectively with diverse teams.

**Communication Skills:** High-quality writing, reporting, and interpersonal communication skills.

**Language Proficiency:** Professional fluency in spoken and written English and Nepali, with advanced English writing skills mandatory for concise and impactful communication.

## 9. Evaluation Criteria and Budget

70% of the weightage is assigned to the technical proposal and 30% to the financial proposal. Technical proposals securing less than 50 out of the total possible 70 will be disqualified. The proposal that scores the highest based on the sum of technical and financial proposal scores will be selected.

The maximum number of points will be allotted to the lowest price proposal that is opened and compared among those invited bidders who obtain the **threshold points (50 points)** in the evaluation of the technical component. All other financial proposals will receive points in inverse proportion to the lowest price, e.g.

## **10. Coordination and supervision**

Under the supervision of Senior Research and MEAL Manager, the consultant will work closely with Habitat Nepal's SAFER Project Manager and MEAL teams. The consultants will be required to undergo a session on Habitat's Safeguarding policies as part of the onboarding process.
